In 1986, Mr. Martin relocated back to Southern CA where he then took a couple jobs in the aerospace industry. One was as an inventory clerk and the other as an optical technician. He also worked as a Reserve Public Safety Officer at Claremont Colleges.

In 1988, Cary went to work at American Honda Motor Company as an Assistant Supervisor and was promoted to Site Supervisor nine months later. Since 2001, Cary has been the Site Security Supervisor at the American Honda's Parts HUB, in Chino, CA. He also oversees the security detail at American Honda's Rider Education Center, in Colton CA.

Over the years, Cary has worked for various security companies at Honda, until 2003, when RMI took over the account and has been the security provider since then. One of the jobs Cary held at American Honda was assisting in training new security staff at various Honda account locations. Heat Illness Prevention

Summer is almost here along with high temperatures. Please remember the following tips to help you not become a victim of a heat illness.

- Try to get enough rest before reporting for work.
- Stay hydrated and contact your supervisor if you do not have access to cool, fresh drinking water and/or shade as needed.

Note: Avoiding caffeinated drinks on hot days may help you stay better hydrated.

- Allow yourself time to become acclimated to hot temperatures and discuss modifying/limiting foot patrols/duties with your supervisor, as needed.
- Reduce exposure to the sun while outside, especially on hot days.
- Report any initial signs of a heatrelated illness in yourself, or another, to your supervisor as soon as possible.

CYBERSECURITY REMINDER: PROTECTING YOURSELF, YOUR COMPANY, AND OTHERS

Cyber threats remain a constant problem for individuals and companies, so it is important to remain vigilant.

Besides malicious PDFs and other file attachments, used to trick you to gain access to your devices, hackers have recently started using malicious HTML attachments. They send these in emails or texts which contain a Subject such as "Urgent Invoice" or other subject to urge or entice you to open it and click on their attachment without scrutinizing who it is from. They further trick you in this process by pretending to be one of your contacts or other trusted sources.

Their goal is to get you to click on and download malicious software like WormGPT. Once installed on your device, it can bypass your computer's security software and controls and allow them to:

- Access your email, social media, banking info, etc.
- Lock you out of your files/data and/or hold it hostage until you pay them.
- Distribute your sensitive, copyrighted, etc., material without your permission.
- Steal and use your identity for fraudulent purposes.
- Access a device's camera, without alerting you, to watch you.
- Spread malware to damage or disrupt other systems in your network or another's.

Steps you can take to protect yourself, your company, and others are:

- Take a moment to attempt to confirm the source of an email or text by reviewing the sender's info before opening it.
- Ask questions like *Am I expecting an invoice or other attachment from this person, etc*?
- Contact the person at a known/trusted number before opening a suspicious email or accessing a text, etc.
- Ensure your system security is current/updated and active (e.g., Endpoint Detection and Response (EDR) or Extended Detection and Response (XDR) software).
- Backup your data off network.
- Notify your supervisor and IT department ASAP for breaches / issues with company devices and your service provider for any personal device breaches / issues.

RMI hopes you stay safe and secure in all areas of your life to include the use of your personal devices. If you have any questions about remaining safe and secure in the area of cybersecurity while on duty, contact your supervisor for further direction.
