Patrol Safety: Patrols are a very vital part of the officer's duties so ensuring the officer can safety perform them is very important.

Therefore, RMI wishes to remind all officers of the following safety precautions:

• Remember to *stop*, *look*, and *listen* before initiating a new patrol.

<u>Stop</u> before entering the area for a survey for security and safety issues.

<u>Look</u> for anything out of the ordinary before, during and even upon termination of the patrol.

<u>Listen</u> for unusual noises or other activity in the area that may need further investigation.

- Whether on a driving or foot patrol, move to a safe location to take a phone or radio call.
- Ensure to have sufficient lighting while on patrol.

Do not drive around with vehicle headlights off at night and do not patrol a building at night with the lights out, in order to be stealthy.
